

Before honor is humility

Honor: ; *any expression of respect or of high estimation by words or actions;*

Humility: freedom from pride and arrogance; submission to the divine will.

Fear: *"standing in awe." This is not simple fear, but reverence, whereby an individual recognizes the power and position of the individual revered and renders him proper respect.*

Pro 15:33 The fear of the LORD is the instruction of wisdom; and **before honour is humility.**

Pro 18:12 Before destruction the heart of man is haughty, and **before honour is humility.**

Pro 22:4 **By humility and the fear of the LORD are riches, and honour, and life.**

Pro 29:23 A man's pride shall bring him low: but **honour shall uphold the humble in spirit.**

Luk 14:11 For whosoever exalteth himself shall be abased; and **he that humbleth himself shall be exalted.**

Psa 147:5 Great is our Lord, and of great power: his understanding is infinite.

Psa 147:6 **The LORD lifteth up the meek:** he casteth the wicked down to the ground.

James 4:10 **Humble yourselves in the sight of the Lord, and he shall lift you up.**

Psa 30:2 O LORD my God, I cried unto thee, and thou hast healed me.

Psa 30:3 O LORD, **thou hast brought up my soul from the grave: thou hast kept me alive, that I should not go down to the pit.**

Psa 113:7 **He raiseth up the poor out of the dust, and lifteth the needy out of the dunghill;**

Psa 113:8 That he may set him with princes, even with the princes of his people.

1Pe 5:5 Likewise, ye younger, submit yourselves unto the elder. Yea, all of you be subject one to another, and be clothed with humility: for **God resisteth the proud, and giveth grace to the humble.**

1Pe 5:6 **Humble yourselves therefore under the mighty hand of God, that he may exalt you in due time:**

1Pe 5:7 Casting all your care upon him; for he careth for you.

Luk 1:51 He hath shewed strength with his arm; **he hath scattered the proud in the imagination of their hearts.**

Luk 1:52 He hath **put down the mighty from their seats, and exalted them of low degree.**

Luk 1:53 He hath filled the hungry with good things; and the rich he hath sent empty away.

Jas 1:9 **Let the brother of low degree rejoice in that he is exalted:**

Jas 1:10 But the rich, in that he is made low: because as the flower of the grass he shall pass away.

Rom 5:6 For **when we were yet without strength, in due time Christ died for the ungodly.**

Php 2:5 **Let this mind be in you,** which was also in Christ Jesus:

Php 2:7 **But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant,** and was made in the likeness of men:

Php 2:8 And being found in fashion as a man, **he humbled himself,** and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross.

Php 2:9 Wherefore **God also hath highly exalted him,** and given him a name which is above every name:

Php 2:10 That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth;

Isa 57:15 For thus saith the high and lofty One that inhabiteth eternity, whose name is Holy; I dwell in the high and holy place, **with him also that is of a contrite and humble spirit, to revive the spirit of the humble, and to revive the heart of the contrite ones.**

Psa 51:17 **The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit: a broken and a contrite heart, O God, thou wilt not despise.**

Psa 34:8 O taste and see that the LORD is good: blessed is the man that trusteth in him.

Psa 34:9 **O fear the LORD, ye his saints: for there is no want to them that fear him.**

Psa 34:10 The young lions do lack, and suffer hunger: but **they that seek the LORD shall not want any good thing.**

Mat 23:10 Neither be ye called masters: for one is your Master, even Christ.

Mat 23:11 But **he that is greatest among you shall be your servant.**

Mat 23:12 And whosoever shall exalt himself shall be abased; and **he that shall humble himself shall be exalted.**

Luk 14:12 Then said he also to him that bade him, When thou makest a dinner or a supper, call not thy friends, nor thy brethren, neither thy kinsmen, nor thy rich neighbours; lest they also bid thee again, and a recompence be made thee.

Luk 14:13 But **when thou makest a feast, call the poor, the maimed, the lame, the blind:**

Luk 14:14 And thou shalt be blessed; for they cannot recompense thee: for thou shalt be recompensed at the resurrection of the just.

Luk 18:11 The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, God, I thank thee, that I am not as other men are, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this publican.

Luk 18:12 I fast twice in the week, I give tithes of all that I possess.

Luk 18:13 And the publican, standing afar off, would not lift up so much as his eyes unto heaven, but smote upon his breast, saying, God be merciful to me a sinner.

Luk 18:14 I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other: for every one that exalteth himself shall be abased; and **he that humbleth himself shall be exalted.**

1Sa 15:17 And Samuel said, **When thou wast little in thine own sight, wast thou not made the head of the tribes of Israel, and the LORD anointed thee king over Israel?**

Psa 138:6 Though the LORD be high, yet hath he respect unto the lowly: but the proud he knoweth afar off.

Isa 2:11 The lofty looks of man shall be humbled, and the haughtiness of men shall be bowed down, and the LORD alone shall be exalted in that day.

Isa 2:12 For the day of the LORD of hosts shall be upon every one that is proud and lofty, and upon every one that is lifted up; and he shall be brought low:
