

# Calm

Mat 8:26 And he saith unto them, Why are ye fearful, O ye of little faith? Then he arose, and rebuked the winds and the sea; and **there was a great calm.**

Psa 91:1 **He that dwelleth in the secret place of the most High shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty.**

Psa 91:2 I will say of the LORD, He is my refuge and my fortress: my God; in him will I trust.

*Barnes-*

*The word rendered “dwelleth” here is a participle from the verb to “sit,” and here means “sitting:” literally, “sitting in the secret place,” etc. The idea is that of calm repose; of resting; of sitting down - as one does in his dwelling.*

Psa 32:7 **Thou art my hiding place; thou shalt preserve me from trouble;** thou shalt compass me about with songs of deliverance. Selah.

Psa 61:2 From the end of the earth will I cry unto thee, when my heart is overwhelmed: **lead me to the rock that is higher than I.**

Psa 107:26 They mount up to the heaven, they go down again to the depths: their soul is melted because of trouble.

Psa 107:27 They reel to and fro, and stagger like a drunken man, and are at their wits' end.

Psa 107:28 Then they cry unto the LORD in their trouble, and he bringeth them out of their distresses.

Psa 107:29 **He maketh the storm a calm, so that the waves thereof are still.**

**Psa 107:30 Then are they glad because they be quiet; so he bringeth them unto their desired haven.**

**Psa 89:9 Thou rulest the raging of the sea: when the waves thereof arise, thou stillest them.**

**Psa 65:7 Which stilleth the noise of the seas, the noise of their waves, and the tumult of the people.**

**Mar 4:39 And he arose, and rebuked the wind, and said unto the sea, Peace, be still. And the wind ceased, and there was a great calm.**

**Mar 4:40 And he said unto them, Why are ye so fearful? how is it that ye have no faith?**

**Pro 1:33 But whoso hearkeneth unto me shall dwell safely, and shall be quiet from fear of evil.**

**Isa 32:18 And my people shall dwell in a peaceable habitation, and in sure dwellings, and in quiet resting places;**

**Psa 93:3 The floods have lifted up, O LORD, the floods have lifted up their voice; the floods lift up their waves.**

**Psa 93:4 The LORD on high is mightier than the noise of many waters, yea, than the mighty waves of the sea.**

**Heb 3:11 So I swear in my wrath, They shall not enter into my rest.)**

**Heb 3:12 Take heed, brethren, lest there be in any of you an evil heart of unbelief, in departing from the living God.**

Heb 4:3 For **we which have believed do enter into rest**, as he said, As I have sworn in my wrath, if they shall enter into my rest: although the works were finished from the foundation of the world.

Heb 4:9 **There remaineth therefore a rest to the people of God.**

Heb 4:10 For he that is entered into his rest, he also hath ceased from his own works, as God did from his.

Jer 6:16 Thus saith the LORD, Stand ye in the ways, and see, and ask for the old paths, where is the good way, and walk therein, and **ye shall find rest for your souls.** But they said, We will not walk therein.

Mat 11:28 **Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest.**

Mat 11:29 Take my yoke upon you, and **learn of me**; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and **ye shall find rest unto your souls.**

Mat 11:30 For **my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.**
